In order to accommodate a larger number of animals, create more space in the stall barn, and have a more accommodating show ring, for 2021 we have rented part of the large "main arena" next door to the traditional barn we have always stalled in, or the "pavilion." The arena is accessed through a tunnel in the back of the pavilion, which is usually closed by a gate during our event. This year, that gate will be open, and will serve as the access to the show ring and the make ready area for the show ring where we will also be holding the social hour/sale heifer display on Friday night. This will allow us to have a large show ring that fits the caliber of show that we have in Reno, as well as a lot more space in the pavilion for stalls.

Because we are unsure of how the optics/acoustics would be having the sale located in the arena, we have opted to build a smaller sale ring in the pavilion, where we will have the Bet on Red sale.

There will be several changes to the locations of the events during the week, but in general we are trying to utilize the spaces that we have paid for on the grounds. The banquet, like last year, will be held on the grounds of the RLEC, most likely in the show ring. Unlike last year, we will also be having the membership meeting on the grounds as well. That will be located in the "Doc Bar" which is a space located on the top floor of the arena overlooking the show ring below.

These expansions will not only offer more space and better facilities but will also allow us to obtain advertising and social media content that will present the event in the best light, and make the event look like what it has been for some time now; a prestigious national red angus event worth traveling to. In order to keep the event growing, and our sale strong, we will need to pull folks from farther east than have traditionally come, and we think these changes will provide the facilities and optics we need to inspire those folks to make the trip to Reno.

That being said, the RWC Show Committee, and the WSRAA Board have asked that all sale and show animals be stalled in the pavilion during the day. This will keep the barn looking full and provide the media that we have worked so hard to develop the grounds aspect of the event in order to obtain. We believe that a 10am tie-in time during the main three days of the event (all animals on Thursday and Friday, and only/all sale animals on Saturday) is reasonable and ask that all exhibitors and breeders comply. You will still be able to wash or dry animals outside after that time, but we do ask that you not have animals stalled in tie outs (horse box stalls) during the day.
